Earn Stamps: For every letter sent and received, children earn unique stamps, sparking their curiosity and motivating continued exchanges.

What Makes Stamplo Special?

Completely Free: Stamplo is, and always will be, free to use. There are no hidden fees or subscriptions.

Educational and Fun: By encouraging children to write regularly, Stamplo promotes both learning and enjoyment in equal measure.

Realistic Delivery Experience: Stamplo replicates the charm of traditional letter writing by introducing a realistic delay based on the distance between countries. Once a letter is approved by a parent, it's "stamped" and takes several days to be "delivered," allowing children to experience the anticipation and excitement of waiting for a response, just like with real mail.

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Introduce Stamplo to Parents




